#### **WORSHIP**

- 15,004 people attended Sunday morning services.
- 560 people attended Wednesday noon Eucharist with Prayers for Healing.
- 16 souls were buried from St. Mary's.
- Six couples were married.
- 31 babies, little ones and children were baptized.
- 36 young people were confirmed and one person was received.
- We held five outdoor worship services with potluck suppers following.
- 2,500 lights adorn our new Christmas tree!

### **MUSIC**

- 15 singers comprise the St. Mary's Choir.
- ► The choir sang about 100 anthems and other special music.
- St. Mary's hosted three performances by outside artists and ensembles.
- Ryan played more than 125 organ pieces during services (not counting weddings and funerals).





### **STEWARDSHIP**

- We received 331 pledged offerings for 2024.
- Together you pledged \$1,327,188
  for the mission and ministry of St.
  Mary's Church for 2024 exceeding
  our goal.
- ▶ There were 55 new pledgers.
- One desire to make our pledged offering in thanksgiving to God for God's goodness and blessings!











#### **OUTREACH**

- We supported eight outreach partners with more than \$73,000.
- We collected 1,239 pounds of food for Thanksgiving meals through GoochlandCares.
- Our team of three spent 15 days visioning with Education = Hope in Kenya, Rwanda, and Uganda.
- ▶ We raised more than \$43,000 at BBQ & Brews.
- We fed 340 people lunch and dinner at CARITAS.
- We filled more than 30 backpacks for the Goochland YMCA and Bright Beginnings program.
- We created 34 Christmas wreaths with love for Gateway Homes.
- Six outreach newsletters informed parishioners about opportunities to serve.
- One commitment to be Christ's Heart and Hands in this world!

### ADULT FORMATION

- Three different book clubs, including a new one for parents, attracted about 50 readers.
- Four Lenten soup suppers fed body and spirit.
- ► Three Lunch & Learn group talks engaged participants.
- Let it Begin with Me group met with 25 participants to discuss racial reconciliation.
- Our first Sacred Ground group enlightened 17 participants.

## CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

- 55 kids attended VBS with more than 20 youth volunteers.
- Note that it is not to be a service.
  10 kids in On-the-Go Camp put in around 80 hours of community service.
- More than 45 kids participated in the Jesse Tree service.
- 120 children and youth performed our Christmas Pageant.
- There were 24 kids in the nursery on Christmas Eve! Average nursery attendance rose by about 35% over the year.
- 25 new kids enrolled in Sunday School this year.







#### YOUTH MINISTRY

- 40 youth participated in worship as acolytes and lectors.
- 20 youth-group meetings attracted at least 20 attendees.
- 20 youth and five adults participated in mission trips.
- The youth raised more than \$1,000 at the pancake supper to support mission trips and outreach partners.
- ▶ 18 youth are in the 2023-24 confirmation class.
- 26 students attended the youth Christmas party.
